Staff Training

The Peaceful Paths Violence Prevention Program has been serving Alachua, Bradford, and Union counties since 2003. We work closely with community members to bring healthy relationships information to local youth and their adult allies. Our program is focused on long term social change around prevention of intimate



partner violence.

We are excited to offer a new training opportunity to our community. We are now providing on-site staff training to interested schools or community agencies who would like to incorporate violence prevention principles and activities into their curriculum or to enhance existing violence prevention efforts. Our training is flexible based on individual needs. We will work

with you to develop the most appropriate and meaningful training. Possible topics we may cover include: dynamics of domestic/dating violence, talking with youth about relationships, media literacy, gender stereotypes, and more!

Chew & Chat

We can also host informal discussions during lunch hour(s) to examine individual violence prevention topics. Chew & chats could be hosted on monthly or semester bases. We'll bring the food—you join in on the chat!

Technical Assistance

Violence prevention staff are available for follow up assistance with individuals who have completed the Train the Trainer Pro-

gram. Possible follow-up services include: brainstorming with individuals or groups who are planning violence prevention activities, curriculum analysis to see how prevention can fit into existing curricula, connection with other community members working on similar projects, moral support, and more! We are happy to collaborate with you in whatever way is most helpful.

Presentation Collaboration

Violence prevention staff can collaborate with staff on presentations to students and/or other staff. This may take the form of kick-off or closing presentations for violence prevention events or supplementary presentations for curricula sessions.
